Rising Together

On the morning of September 11, 2001, life in the United States changed in ways few could have imagined. News spread quickly that planes had struck the Twin Towers in New York City and the Pentagon in Washington, D.C. Fear and confusion filled the air, yet amid the chaos, something powerful emerged—unity. Strangers helped one another escape danger, firefighters and police officers ran toward the destruction, and citizens across the nation searched for ways to help.

In the days that followed, people lined up to donate blood, communities held candlelight vigils, and classrooms became places of comfort and conversation. The flag became a symbol of hope, waving proudly above schools, firehouses, and homes.
