

Peter's Message Modernized Answer Key

A strong response should:

- Explain that the Holy Spirit arrived
- Share that the message gives hope and invites people to believe
- Include Peter's call to listen, change hearts, and stay united
- Use 5-6 complete and meaningful sentences (Responses will vary; assess clarity and content connection.)

Sample acceptably phrased idea:

"God is helping us speak with courage. This message is for everyone, not just a few people. We should listen and live with hope. Let's work together and believe that good things are happening."

Teacher's Guide

Quick Tips for Differentiation

- Sentence starter supports: "Peter wanted people to know..." "This message matters because..."
- Advanced task: add one rhetorical question or a call-to-action statement
- Peer feedback checklist: "Do I understand the message clearly?"

Engagement Ideas

- Mini-debate: "What would make a message powerful today?"
- Role-play: Students take turns delivering their rewritten message aloud
- QR code or audio option: Students record a "modern message" speech

Extension Activities

- Turn message into a positive poster or social media graphic
- Create two versions: one for younger kids, one for teens
- Include reflection: "How can we spread hope in modern ways?"
