Quick Tips for Differentiation

- *Support option:* Allow students to highlight key action words (causes) and results (effects) in different colors.
- *Challenge:* Students write one new cause-and-effect pair from their own summary of Pentecost.
- *Multimodal:* Read aloud or show a simplified Pentecost video first for context.

Engagement Ideas

- "Human Match Game": Hand out cause cards and effect cards-students walk around to find their match.
- Group discussion prompt: "Why does one event often lead to another?"

Extension Activities

- Students create a timeline showing cause-and-effect connections in order.
- Art tie-in: illustrate one cause-and-effect moment with symbols (wind, flames, crowd).
- SEL link: identify a real-life example where a positive action led to a positive outcome.
