### Teacher's Guide

- **Purpose:** Teaches students to recognize the difference between safe and unsafe physical contact, reinforcing self-protection and consent.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Read examples aloud for students with reading difficulties.
  - Use visual aids showing safe and unsafe situations to increase comprehension.
  - Offer verbal response options or use sorting cards for hands-on learners.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Role-play safe greeting examples (high-five, handshake) to model appropriate contact.
  - Use color codes (green for safe, red for unsafe) for visual learners.
- **Extension Ideas:**
  - Discuss how to say "no" or get help from a trusted adult if an unsafe touch happens.
  - Invite students to draw two pictures: one showing a safe touch and one showing a safe way to respond to unsafe touch.
