### Teacher's Guide

- Remind students that every **problem** should lead to a **solution** that makes sense, not a random ending.
- Encourage students to read all solutions before choosing. Ask guiding questions like: What would a character really do next?

### Differentiation Tips

- Read problems aloud for emerging readers.
- Allow students who need extra support to match using cutout cards before writing.

### Engagement Ideas

- Ask students to act out each problem and brainstorm possible solutions as a group.
- Let partners explain why the solution they chose is the most logical.
- Have students illustrate one of the matched pairs.

### Extension Ideas

- Invite students to create their own problem on one side of an index card and a matching solution on the other.
- Challenge advanced students to write a short story using one of the pairs.
- Encourage students to sort problems into categories like **school**, **playground**, or **home**, then write related solutions.
