Narrator's Lens Answer Key

- 1. The narrator's cheerful, personal perspective creates a **happy and upbeat** mood.
- 2. The second-person narration, with words like *groaning*, *shadows*, and *shiver*, creates a **creepy and tense mood**.
- 3. By showing Marcus's inner thoughts and feelings, the narrator shapes the tone to be **disappointed and serious**.
- 4. The excited narrator's focus on the cheering crowd creates a joyful and energetic mood.

Teacher Notes/Guide

- Stress the difference between mood (reader's feelings) and tone (narrator's attitude).
- Have students highlight **descriptive words** that signal the narrator's attitude (e.g., *shining*, *perfect*, *groaning*, *disappointment*, *joy*).
- Differentiation tip:
 - \circ For beginners \rightarrow focus only on mood.
 - o For advanced → ask them to explain how a different narrator would change the passage's effect (e.g., a sad narrator describing the same sunny day).
- This builds critical thinking by connecting narrator's lens to reader experience.
