Exit Slip: POV Check Answer Key

- 1. First-person uses *I*, *my* to show the narrator is a character in the story.
- 2. Second-person directly addresses the reader with you, your.
- 3. Third-person limited narrator reveals only Daniel's inner thoughts/feelings.
- 4. Third-person omniscient narrator reveals Lena's hopes and Mateo's confidence.
- 5. Third-person objective narrator describes only actions/behaviors, no inner thoughts revealed.

Teacher Notes/Guide

- Great as a quick comprehension check at the end of a lesson (exit ticket format).
- Encourage students to highlight pronouns and underline any thought/feeling words to justify their answers.
- Note: Passage 5 introduces third-person objective, which shows only what can be seen or heard (no inner thoughts). This is useful for advanced learners.
- Differentiation tip:
 - o Beginners: identify only first, second, or third person.
 - Advanced: distinguish between limited, omniscient, and objective.
