Predicting Character Change Answer Key

Note: Predictions will vary, but they must be **reasonable and supported with evidence** from the passage. Sample answers below model strong responses.

1. Choices Leah faces:

- Auditioning for the play despite her nerves.
- Running away to avoid embarrassment.

2. Sample Prediction (What Leah will do next):

Leah will likely take a deep breath and perform her audition because she practiced so much. The mention of her preparation suggests she wants to prove herself.

3. Prediction of Character Growth:

If Leah auditions, she may become more confident and proud of herself, even if she doesn't get the lead role. She may learn that courage comes from trying, not just succeeding.

4. Alternative Path:

If Leah runs away, she might feel regret and disappointment for not using her hard work. This could lead to a story about missed opportunities or second chances instead of growth through bravery.

Teacher Notes:

- Encourage students to see both the immediate prediction (next action) and the longer-term character path (how choices shape growth).
- Highlight how authors use internal conflict (fear vs. desire) to build suspense.
- A useful extension: let students write two alternate short continuations (one for each possible choice) and compare outcomes.
