Exit Slip: Making Predictions

Good readers don't stop thinking when the chapter ends. They use what already happened: characters' actions, problems, and clues, to predict what might happen next. An **exit slip** is a short written response at the end of class to show your thinking.

Passage Recap (Chapter Ending)

At the end of foday's reading, write a short response (3-4 sentences):
1. What do you predict will happen in the next chapter?
2. What text clues from the ending help you make this prediction?
3. Why does this prediction make sense for the story's direction?
