# **Story Starter Forecast Answer Key**

**Note**: Predictions are open-ended. The purpose is not to be right but to **practice** reasoning with text clues. Sample answers below show reasonable forecasts.

### Passage A - Sample Prediction:

Mia and Jordan might be going on an adventure or a treasure hunt, guided by the map. They may spend the summer exploring new places.

• Key evidence: "map," "backpack full of supplies," "first day of summer vacation."

#### Passage B - Sample Prediction:

Sam and his sister may need to find shelter from the storm. The story might involve a power outage, flooding, or a tense moment with lightning.

• Key evidence: "thunder cracked," "dark clouds," "pulled his little sister closer."

## Passage C - Sample Prediction:

The experiment could involve a surprising chemical reaction, maybe fizzing or an explosion. The text may describe the students' reactions as they watch.

 Key evidence: "science lab," "beaker," "today's experiment might surprise you."

#### **Teacher Notes:**

- Stress that predictions should be text-based; students must point to specific clues in the opening sentences.
- This builds habits of active reading and anticipation that strengthen comprehension.
