

Prefix Makeover Mission Answer Key

Example Rewritten Story:

Mia reworked her art project all afternoon. She tried to repaint a sunset, but she accidentally spilled water on it and had to restart. Then she rebuilt a new picture frame, but one side broke again. Mia decided to refix it and repaint the frame gold. Finally, she showed her teacher the redone project and smiled proudly.

Possible Answers:

1. **Problem:** Mia spilled water on her paper and later broke part of her picture frame.
2. **Response:** She didn't give up—she started again, fixed the frame, and kept working until it was finished.
3. **Attitude:** Mia is determined, patient, and willing to try again after mistakes.
4. **Effect of Prefix Verbs:** Using prefix verbs like restart, rebuild, and repaint shows action, progress, and persistence more clearly, making the story sound more dynamic.
5. **Lesson:** The story teaches that perseverance and effort—trying again after setbacks—lead to success and pride in one's work.

Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students will apply knowledge of prefixes to modify base verbs in context and analyze how meaning changes.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Allow emerging writers to orally explain their rewritten version before writing it.
 - Challenge advanced learners to use at least five different prefixes.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Ask students to create their own short paragraph using five prefix verbs.
 - Have them highlight each prefix in a different color to visualize how prefixes shift word meaning.
