Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students will form antonyms by adding prefixes and understand how prefixes reverse or change word meanings.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - Review each prefix's meaning before starting: **un-** (not), **dis-** (opposite of), **in-/im-** (not).
 - Allow struggling students to use prefix flashcards for matching practice.
 - Encourage advanced students to write sentences using both the base and new words (e.g., *fair / unfair*).
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn it into a "Prefix Magic Show" where students "transform" base words by waving a pretend wand and saying the new word aloud.
 - Use a class prefix wall with examples to reinforce ongoing learning.
- **Extension Ideas:**
 - Have students brainstorm other prefixes that create opposites (like *ir-* or *non-*).
 - Challenge them to find these opposite pairs in reading passages or real-world contexts (signs, books, or ads).
