Teacher Notes

- Focus Point: This activity encourages students to form present continuous sentences naturally in real conversation.
- **Teaching Tip**: Model the question "What are you doing?" and a few correct responses before starting the activity.
- Common Error Alert: Students may forget to use is/are + -ing. Reinforce the formula: Subject + am/is/are + verb-ing.
- Extension Idea: Turn the survey into a graphing activity: have students tally how many classmates are doing similar actions (e.g., "3 students are writing, 2 students are talking") and present results to the class.
