## From Now to Always Answer Key

(Answers may vary slightly in wording, but must correctly use the *simple present tense*.)

1. She eats breakfast.
2. They play soccer in the park.
3. I ride my bike to school.
4. The teacher explains the lesson.
5. The students read books quietly.
6. We practice for the play.
7. He studies English with his tutor.
8. They clean their room.
9. I listen to music on my phone.
10. The dog runs in the yard.

### Teacher Notes

- **Focus Point:** This activity helps students **contrast present continuous** (temporary, right now) with the **simple present** (habitual, always true).
- **Common Errors:** Students often forget to change the auxiliary (*is/are/am*) and drop the *-ing*. Remind them that in the **simple present**, verbs may add *-s* with singular subjects (e.g., *She draws*).
- **Teaching Tip:** After rewriting, have students **say both versions** aloud (e.g., *She is eating breakfast* → *She eats breakfast*) to hear the difference in meaning.
- **Extension Idea:** Ask students to write **two of their own sentences** in the present continuous, then transform them into simple present.
