

## Continuous Corrections Answer Key

### Corrected Sentences:

1. She **has been playing** the piano for two hours.
2. We **have been waiting** for the bus since morning.
3. They **have been studying** English for five years.
4. He **has been working** at the library lately.
5. I **have been learning** how to swim all summer.
6. The children **have been playing** soccer in the park.
7. My teacher **has been explaining** the lesson clearly.
8. It **has been raining** (omit “yesterday evening” because PPC shows ongoing action, not a finished past event).
9. We **have been talking** on the phone. (remove “right now” → use present continuous for “right now,” but acceptable as corrected here).
10. He **has been running** every morning before breakfast.

### Teacher Notes:

- Remind students that the **present perfect continuous** requires **has/have + been + verb(-ing)**.
- Highlight **subject-verb agreement** mistakes (e.g., “She have” → “She has”).
- Point out **wrong verb forms** (“studies” → “studying”).
- Discuss time expressions: *for/since* work well with this tense, but “**yesterday**” or “**right now**” usually do not.
- Extension: Ask students to create their own “**wrong**” sentences for classmates to correct.
