Underlined Verbs

- have **already** raised
- have **already** visited
- have **already** praised
- haven't **reached** ... **yet**
- haven't **collected** ... **yet**
- haven't **joined** ... **yet**

Comprehension Answers (sample full sentences with *already*/*yet*)

1. The students have already raised over \$2,000.
2. They have already visited three elementary schools.
3. Teachers have already praised the students for their teamwork and creativity.
4. The students haven't reached their goal of \$5,000 yet.
5. Local businesses haven't joined the project yet.

Teacher's Notes

- **Focus Point:** Emphasize how *already* shows something is completed sooner than expected, while *yet* shows something is unfinished but expected.
- **Common Error:** Students may place *already* at the end instead of mid-sentence (*They have raised \$2,000 already* is correct but less natural for beginners). Encourage standard placement (*have already* + *past participle*).
- **Extension Activity:** Ask students to turn the article into a mini-class roleplay: one group plays reporters, others act as the students. They must ask and answer questions using *already* and *yet*.
- **Differentiation:** Stronger learners can write their own "mock news headline" using at least two sentences with *already* and one with *yet*.
