Later, Sophia borrowed a biography of Earhart that described her childhood and career in detail, using information gathered by historians. She also listened to an old radio recording in which Earhart talked about one of her flights across the Atlantic Ocean. Wanting more perspectives, Sophia visited a website that compared Earhart to modern female pilots and analyzed her lasting influence. While in the library, she held a copy of a 1932 newspaper reporting Earhart's record-breaking solo flight. Finally, she read a chapter in her history textbook that connected Earhart's accomplishments to larger trends in women's rights during the early 20th century.
