Quote Vs. Summary Answer Key

- 1. **P** Direct quote from Goodall = Primary.
- 2. **S** Paraphrased explanation from narrator = Secondary.
- 3. **S** Magazine article summarizing her influence = Secondary.
- 4. **P** Transcript of her own speech = Primary.
- 5. **S** Documentary summary = Secondary.

Teacher's Notes:

- Reinforce that direct quotes and original words from a person count as primary.
- Emphasize that summaries, explanations, or retellings by another author or narrator are secondary.
- Some students may confuse speeches with summaries; remind them that
 the speech itself is a primary source, but an article about the speech would
 be secondary.
- Extension idea: Have students create two examples of their own: one direct
 quote and one summary about the same topic, then swap with a partner
 to identify.
