Teacher's Guide

• Differentiation Tips:

- Read each pair aloud and define cause and effect clearly before starting.
- Provide sentence stems such as "If I choose to..., the result might be..."
 to guide thinking.
- o Allow students to use colored pencils to visually link matching pairs.

Engagement Ideas:

- Have students act out one poor and one positive choice to explore differences in tone and emotion.
