### Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Read each scenario aloud for emerging readers.
  - Provide visuals or icons representing each solution (sharing, talking, taking turns).
  - Allow students to act out the problem and then choose the best letter aloud before writing.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
  - Create "Playground Role-Play Stations" where pairs act out conflicts and model positive responses.
  - Encourage students to brainstorm more peaceful solutions as a class and add them to a "Peace Wall."
  - Discuss how emotions can affect decision-making and practice calming techniques together.
- **Extension Activities:**
  - Have students write or draw one playground problem they have faced and show how they solved it peacefully.
  - Use recess reflection journals for students to record how they used problem-solving skills during the week.
  - Turn the matching items into a "Peaceful Choices" classroom poster for quick reminders before recess.
