




Layer	Purpose	Example
Top Bun: Context /	Introduces the situation or role. It helps the AI "understand who it is" and what perspective to take.	"You are a 5th-grade teacher preparing a short science lesson about ecosystems."
Action	Describes exactly what you want the AI to do. Be clear, specific, and measurable.	"Create 5 comprehension questions that check student understanding."
Output Constraints	Explains how you want the answer presented. This might include format, tone, length, or audience.	"Present the questions in a numbered list with an answer key below."
