Today you'll learn how to "coach" an Al to write creative pieces that sound exciting and original. Each time you fill in a section below, you are adding one important layer of your Prompt Sandwich. When you're done, you'll have a complete prompt ready to test.
Step 1 - Choose the Role: Think about <i>who</i> the AI should pretend to be. A role helps it adopt the right tone and style.
Examples: a children's author, a fantasy novelist, a poet, a screenwriter.

Step 2 - Define the Task - Tell the Al exactly what kind of creative work you want.
Examples: Write a short story about a mysterious door. Create a poem that describes the sound of rain. Invent a main character for a superhero comic.

Step 3 - Add Context - Explain <i>why</i> or <i>for whom</i> the piece is being written. This helps the Al match the tone.
Examples: For a class anthology of flash fiction. For a group of 8th-grade readers who like suspense. For a writing contest about courage.

Step 4 - Set Constraints - Give limits or rules to keep the Al focused.
Examples: 200 words or less. Include dialogue between two characters. End with a surprising twist. Use first-person point of view.

Examples: As a short story with a title and paragraph breaks. As a poem with four stanzas. As a script with character names and dialogue.
