Sample Rewrites in Different Formats

- **As a List:**

"Give me a numbered list of at least ten study tips that students can use before a big test."

- Clear list structure, easy to scan.

- **As a Paragraph:**

"Write one well-developed paragraph that explains several study tips for students preparing for exams."

- Blends tips into continuous prose, useful for flowing explanations.

- **As a Table:**

"Create a two-column table with study tips in one column and short explanations of why they are effective in the other."

- Adds organization + quick comparisons.

- **As Steps (like instructions):**

"Provide a step-by-step guide for how a student should prepare for a test, beginning one week before and ending the night before the exam."

- Builds a logical sequence of actions.

Reflection (Possible Answers)

- **Easiest Format to Use:**

- Many students might say *list* or *steps* because they are straightforward and scannable.

- **Hardest Format to Learn From:**

- Some may say *paragraph* (harder to pick out details) or *table* (if they're not used to reading them).
