Sometimes prompts aren't neutral-they sneak in <b>bias</b> , assumptions, or loaded language. That means the Al could respond unfairly, one-sided, or even misleadingly. Your job: read each biased prompt, spot what's wrong, and rewrite it in a neutral, fair way. Think of yourself as a detective: sniff out the hidden slant and clean it up.
