The level of detail?

Prompt A - "Write a detailed, step-by-step guide for how a beginner can start gardening, including tips for selecting plants, preparing soil, and maintaining healthy growth."

Prompt B - "Write a friendly, step-by-step guide for how a beginner can start gardening, with suggestions for selecting beginner-friendly plants, preparing soil for small spaces, and maintaining plant health over time."
