Teacher's Guide

- **Differentiation Tips:**

- Offer a mini-lesson on what makes something a **proverb**-short, wise sayings that teach a lesson or truth.
- Let younger students use context clues or illustrations to guess meanings.
- Encourage advanced students to explain why the made-up phrases don't qualify as real proverbs.

- **Engagement Ideas:**

- Have students invent their own silly "fake proverbs," then trade papers and guess which are real.
- Create a "Proverb Hall of Fame" on the classroom wall, where students add favorite sayings with meanings.

- **Extension Activities:**

- Assign students to find proverbs from different cultures and compare them to English versions.
- Ask them to write short stories or comic strips based on one of the proverbs in the list.
- Encourage a weekly "Proverb Spotlight" where a student explains one proverb and how it applies to life.
