The Wright Brothers Take Flight

In 1903, Orville and Wilbur Wright achieved the first successful powered flight in Kitty Hawk, North Carolina. Their plane, the Flyer, stayed in the air for just 12 seconds and traveled 120 feet, but it marked the beginning of modern aviation. The brothers were bicycle makers who experimented with wings, propellers, and engines before achieving success. Many people doubted that human flight was possible, yet the Wrights proved otherwise. Their invention sparked worldwide interest in aviation, leading to rapid improvements in aircraft design. Within just a few decades, planes could travel across oceans and carry passengers. Today, air travel is considered one of the fastest ways to connect people across the globe.
