The First Spacewalk

In 1965, astronaut Alexei Leonov of the Soviet Union became the first human to walk in space. He stepped outside his spacecraft, connected only by a tether, and floated freely above Earth. The walk lasted about 12 minutes, but it was extremely dangerous. Leonov's suit ballooned in the vacuum of space, making it difficult for him to move. He barely managed to get back inside the spacecraft by releasing some of the air in his suit. Despite the risks, the spacewalk was a historic milestone that proved humans could survive and work outside their spacecraft. It paved the way for future missions, including the Apollo moon landings and today's International Space Station activities.
