#### Teacher's Guide

### **Instruction Tips**

- Review common conjunctions: and, but, so, because.
- Model one example and talk about how combining sentences makes writing smoother.
- Remind students to check commas where needed.

#### Differentiation

- Support: Provide a conjunction word bank for each question or allow students to choose from two options.
- Challenge: Encourage adding descriptive details (e.g., "We wake up early so we can eat a healthy suhoor before the sun rises.").
- ELL Support: Use gestures or graphics to explain conjunction meanings (e.g., "so" = result, "because" = reason).

## **Engagement Ideas**

- Pair students for "Conjunction Coach" one writes, the other checks for correct conjunction use.
- Conjunction sort: students sort example sentences by which conjunction was used.
