Teacher's Guide

- Review common prepositions that tell time (at, during), place (in, at), and relationships (with, from).
- Read each sentence aloud and let students act out the prepositions when possible (e.g., point to the sky for "in the night sky").
- Provide a preposition word bank for students who need support.

Differentiation

- Support: Offer choices under each blank (e.g., in / at / with).
- Challenge: Ask students to write a new sentence about Ramadan using two prepositions.
- ELL Support: Use visuals or quick sketches to show meaning of each preposition.

Extension Activities

- Students can rewrite 3-5 sentences adding more detail (e.g., "Families gather at sunset in the backyard to enjoy iftar.")
- Ask students to illustrate one sentence showing the placement or timing described by the preposition.
