Note: Answers will vary. Below is a model example showing correct use of all eight rare words.

Teacher's Guide

 Purpose: This creative challenge helps students apply rare vocabulary in meaningful, contextual writing, strengthening comprehension, word recall, and stylistic fluency.

• Teaching Tips:

- 1. Discuss each word's definition and origin before writing to ensure comprehension.
- 2. Encourage students to brainstorm sentence ideas for each word first, then connect them into a cohesive narrative.

Differentiation:

- 1. *Support:* Provide sentence stems or allow students to use only 5 of the 8 rare words.
- 2. Challenge: Require students to weave all 8 words naturally into a story under 150 words.
- Engagement Idea: Host a "Rare Word Story Slam" where students read their pieces dramatically to the class, and peers guess which rare word was hardest to fit in.
- Extension Activity: Ask students to highlight the rare words, then replace each with a simpler synonym to compare tone and precision.
