

## Figures In The Night Answer Key

1. **Simile:** "The moon hung above the garden like a silver lantern."
  - Comparison: The moon is compared to a lantern, showing how it lights the night.
2. **Metaphor:** "Her excitement blooming inside her like the opening of a sunflower."
  - Meaning: Her excitement is compared to a flower growing, showing it is natural and full of life.
3. **Personification:** "The roses seemed to whisper secrets" or "The oak tree stretched its arms."
  - Effect: These give the plants human qualities, making the setting feel alive and mysterious.
4. **Engagement:** Figurative language helps readers imagine the scene more vividly, turning ordinary descriptions (moon, roses, tree) into lively and emotional images that enhance mood and atmosphere.

### Teacher Notes:

- Remind them that figurative language is about **deeper meaning**; not just identifying words but explaining their effect.
