Locked Mysteries Answer Key

- 1. Point of View: First-person.
- 2. **Clues**: The narrator uses "I" and "my" (e.g., "I never should have followed my brother," "My hands shook").
- 3. **Effect of POV**: The reader experiences the fear and uncertainty directly through the narrator's emotions and thoughts, making the suspense more personal and intense.
- 4. Different POV Example: If told in third-person limited from the brother's perspective, readers might focus more on his excitement about the discovery instead of the narrator's fear. In third-person omniscient, readers might even learn what the key unlocks, which would reduce the suspense.

Teacher Notes:

- Highlight that first-person narration lets readers feel closely connected to the narrator's inner thoughts.
- Contrast this with third-person limited (one character's thoughts, told with "he/she/they") and third-person omniscient (all characters' thoughts, broader view).
- Encourage discussion on how point of view creates different emotional impacts in storytelling.
