## Clarity Check Answer Key

### Common Problems Students Should Identify

- Vague words such as **things**, **stuff**, **nice**, and **correctly**.
- Missing information like **where**, **when**, **how**, and **what tools or files** are required.
- No clear order, time limits, or expectations.

### Sample Clear Rewrites

#### Poster Setup Example

1. Tape the poster to the center of the back wall using four pieces of clear tape.
2. Use markers and colored pencils to add titles and labels.
3. Make sure all text is neat and large enough to read from five feet away.

#### File Submission Example

1. Upload your document to the class assignment folder on the school website.
2. Rename the file using your last name and class period.
3. Click the submit button before the deadline posted by your teacher.

Other student answers may vary as long as they improve **specificity**, **order**, and **clarity**.

### Teacher's Guide

- This worksheet develops **advanced procedural reading**, **clarity analysis**, and **revision skills**.
- For support, model how vague words reduce understanding before students begin.
- For engagement, allow students to swap rewritten instructions and test whether classmates can follow them.
- For extension, challenge students to rewrite real classroom instructions from memory with improved clarity.
- For advanced learners, have students label whether each error is caused by **missing detail**, **vague wording**, or **poor sequencing**.
