

Listing Evidence Answer Key

- Claim One evidence examples:
 - At first, only a few people showed up.
 - By the third weekend, more than fifty volunteers were working together.
- Claim Two evidence examples:
 - Students cleaned the paths and planted flowers.
 - They repainted the picnic tables.
- Claim Three evidence examples:
 - The parks director noticed the change.
 - He donated new trash bins and benches.
- Claim Four evidence examples:
 - Families returned to the park for picnics and games.
 - The once littered field was full of laughter again.

Teacher's Guide

- This worksheet strengthens **justification skills** by requiring students to connect **claims to direct text evidence**.
- For differentiation:
 - Allow struggling students to underline evidence in the passage before writing it.
 - Ask advanced students to explain why their evidence proves the claim using complete sentences.
- For engagement:
 - Read each claim aloud and let students hunt for evidence as a class before independent work.
 - Turn the activity into a partner challenge where teams compete to find the strongest proof first.
- For extension:
 - Have students write their own claim about the passage and swap with a classmate to find evidence.
 - Connect the task to science or social studies reading where evidence is also required.
