Twister Word Swap

Directions: Pair up with a partner. Decide who will be **Reader A** and who will be **Reader B**. Read the tongue twister aloud **together**, but each of you only says **every other word**. (Example: Reader A says the 1st word, Reader B says the 2nd, Reader A says the 3rd, and so on.) Continue the pattern until the end of the tongue twister. Switch roles (who starts first) on the next tongue twister. Try to keep the reading **smooth and fluent**, as if one person is reading.

2. **Silly sailors swiftly sailed seven small ships south.**
3. **Green grasshoppers gracefully grabbed golden grains gleefully.**
