

## Safety In Social Interactions Answer Key

*(Sample Responses - use as guidance for teacher or caregiver)*

1. An unsafe friendship includes control, pressure, or constant guilt.
2. I told an adult or left the situation; next time, I would speak up sooner.
3. Warning signs include refusing to video chat, asking for private info, or acting secretive.
4. Use privacy settings, avoid sharing personal details, and never post private photos.
5. Trusted adults can give help, guidance, and protect your safety.
6. Listen, show care, and encourage the friend to get adult help.

### Teacher's Guide

- **Objective:** Students reflect on how to recognize, avoid, and respond to unsafe or unhealthy social interactions both in person and online.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
  - Allow verbal responses for students who find writing difficult.
  - Provide sentence starters like "An unsafe friendship feels..." or "A warning sign online is..."
  - Offer guided group discussion before writing to help students brainstorm.
- **Engagement Strategies:**
  - Use real-life examples or short video clips about online safety or healthy friendships to spark conversation.
  - Encourage students to role-play "safe vs. unsafe" responses in small groups.
- **Extension Ideas:**
  - Have students create personal "Safety Plans" listing three trusted adults they can talk to.
  - Invite students to write an advice letter to a peer about how to stay safe in relationships or online spaces.
