Sample Rewrites

Teacher's Guide

- **Focus Skill:** Strengthening understanding of **root word families** and how **prefixes/suffixes** alter meaning while keeping a shared base.
- **Differentiation Tips:**
 - For younger or struggling learners: Provide a **root reference list** (e.g., *struct* = *build*, *rupt* = *break*) before reading.
 - For advanced learners: Challenge them to replace additional non-underlined words with others from the same root set.
- **Engagement Ideas:**
 - Turn it into a "Root Rewrite Relay": groups take turns rewriting sentences aloud with their new word choices.
 - Have students color-code roots (e.g., highlight all *struct* words in blue) to visualize how meanings connect.
- **Extension Activities:**
 - Ask students to create their own short paragraph using at least two different root families.
 - Encourage creative storytelling: students write a short "root swap" sequel using new word sets like *spect* or *scrib*.
