### **Possible Responses**

- 1. The speaker is afraid of the court and the consequences of not cooperating.

- Role-play short, historically sensitive mock interviews to explore perspective.
- o Use think-pair-share before writing to help develop ideas.

#### Extension Ideas:

- Compare a confession to a modern-day legal right (e.g., protection against forced confession).
