Sample Responses

One-Sentence Summary (Sample):

Two students accidentally swapped their art labels before the show and discover the mistake with help from their teacher.

Teacher's Guide / Notes

- **Objective:** To strengthen **oral fluency**, **listening comprehension**, and **main idea identification** through one-sentence summaries after performance reading.
- **Before Reading:**
 - Model a fluent script reading with natural expression and pacing.
 - Remind students that summarizing is about the **essence** of the scene: who it's about and what happens.
- **During Reading:**
 - Encourage small groups to practice reading smoothly, with proper pauses and tone shifts.
 - Prompt students to visualize the scene like a snapshot before summarizing.
- **After Reading:**
 - Have students share their one-sentence summaries aloud for feedback on clarity and conciseness.
 - Reinforce that summarizing aloud strengthens both **comprehension** and **verbal fluency**.
- **Extension Options:**
 - Have students create a "Scene Snapshot" board, drawing one image that represents their summary sentence.
 - Challenge advanced readers to write a five-word micro-summary that captures the scene's essence.
