Sensory Scene Builder Answer Key

Answers will vary. Below is a model response:

- Sight: I see colorful fish swimming in tanks and small pets moving around.
- Sound: I hear squeaks, chirps, and water bubbling.
- Smell: I smell a mix of wood shavings and clean water.
- Taste: I taste the warm air as I talk and breathe inside the shop.
- Touch: I feel soft fur when I pet one of the animals.
- Combined paragraph: Inside the busy pet shop, colorful fish swim while small animals scamper around. Squeaks, chirps, and bubbling water fill the air, which smells like wood shavings and fresh water. I taste the warm indoor air as I talk, and I feel soft fur under my hand as I explore.

Teacher's Guide

- Review **all five senses** before beginning. Emphasize that each sentence should match one sense only.
- Read the settings aloud and discuss possible sensory details as a group.
 Encourage students to visualize each setting clearly.
- For differentiation, provide sentence frames or a word bank of sensory adjectives and verbs. Allow oral dictation for students who need writing support.
- For engagement, let students close their eyes to imagine each setting or listen to short sound clips that match the scenes.
- For extension, invite students to create their own third setting and complete
 another five sentence set, or have them combine both paragraphs into a
 longer descriptive piece.
