Teacher's Guide

- Use this worksheet to help students connect descriptive vocabulary to the five senses. Review each sense before beginning.

- For differentiation, allow students to sort the words by circling instead of writing, or read the words aloud for students who need help decoding.
- For engagement, let students act out or demonstrate a word before sorting it.
