

Adjective Clause Combiners Answer Key

(Students' answers may vary; any correct adjective clause is acceptable.)

1. The boy, **who wears a red hat**, is my neighbor.
2. The movie, **which won three awards**, was exciting.
3. The woman, **who is a doctor**, lives next door.
4. I read a story **that was about dragons**.
5. The park, **which has tall oak trees**, is beautiful.
6. The athlete, **who trained hard**, won the gold medal.
7. The book **that you gave me** is on the shelf.
8. The car, **which was built in Germany**, is expensive.

Teacher Notes

- **Key Concept:** Adjective clauses describe nouns and begin with relative pronouns (who, which, that, whose, whom).
- **Comma Rule:** Use commas for non-essential clauses (extra detail), but not for essential clauses (needed to identify the noun).
- **Flexibility:** Many answers are possible; the key is a correctly formed adjective clause that makes sense.
- **Extension Idea:** Have students rewrite their adjective clause sentences twice: once with the clause in the middle of the sentence, and once at the end.
