Conjunction Bridge Answer Key

(Students' sentences may vary as long as they use a correct conjunction and keep the meaning clear.)

1. The dog barked, **and** the cat hissed.
2. Mia studied hard, **but** she still felt nervous about the test.
3. The sun was shining, **yet** we brought our umbrellas.
4. Alex could ride his bike, **or** he could take the bus.
5. The pizza looked delicious, **but** it was too hot to eat.
6. We visited the zoo, **and** we saw lions and zebras too.
7. The team practiced every day, **so** they wanted to win the championship.
8. He tried to fix the computer, **but** it would not turn on.

Sample Expansions

(Encourage creativity; many correct answers possible.)

9. Sarah loves to read, **and** she often goes to the library.
10. I want to play outside, **but** it is raining.

Teacher Notes

- Remind students that coordinating conjunctions connect **equal ideas** (two independent clauses).
- Encourage use of commas before conjunctions when joining two full sentences.
- Accept a variety of answers, but watch for run-ons or fragments.
- Expansion activity allows students to practice creativity while applying the skill.
