Two To Compound Answer Key

(Students' answers may vary, but they must form correct compound sentences with proper conjunctions and punctuation.)

1. The car is old, **but** it still runs well.
2. We could go to the park, **or** we could stay home.
3. I wanted to buy the book, **but** I did not have enough money.
4. The teacher smiled, **and** the students cheered.
5. The storm was strong, **yet** the houses were not damaged.
6. He packed his bags, **but** he forgot his passport.
7. We cooked pasta, **and** we also made a salad.
8. Maria worked hard, **so** she earned a promotion.

Teacher Notes

- **Key Concept:** A compound sentence joins two **independent clauses** with a coordinating conjunction.
- **Comma Rule:** Place a comma before the conjunction when connecting two full sentences.
- **Flexibility:** Students may choose different conjunctions as long as the sentence remains logical.
