Clause-to-Clause Bridge

The coordinating conjunctions are **FANBOYS**: **for, and, nor, but, or, yet, so**. In diagramming:

- When a conjunction joins **words**, the words are placed on the same line, joined by a dotted line with the conjunction.
- When a conjunction joins **clauses**, each clause has its own subject and verb on separate lines, connected by a dotted line with the conjunction.
