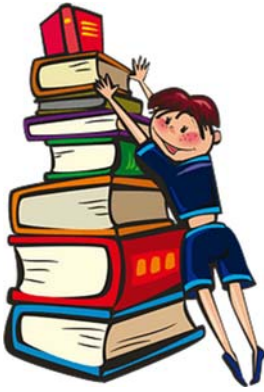

Pass The Sentence

Directions: Form a **small group of 3-5 students**. Read the sentences below **in order**, with each student reading **one sentence aloud** before the next person continues. The goal is to keep the **pacing seamless**: no long pauses, no overlap. Listen carefully so you know **exactly when to begin** your part.

After one full round, repeat the relay with smoother transitions and stronger expression. Finally, discuss as a group which sentences flowed best and which ones sounded bumpy, then reread those until they sound natural.
