

Pass The Sentence Answer Key

Sample Transition Notes:

- **Between 1 and 2:** Begin sentence 2 immediately after “meadow.” Pause less than a second to keep rhythm.
- **Between 3 and 4:** Lower your voice at the end of 3; next reader starts smoothly to mimic a calm morning tone.
- **Between 6 and 7:** Add a slight lift in tone, signal the shift from nature imagery to human activity.
- **Between 9 and 10:** End sentence 9 with cheerful pacing, and deliver sentence 10 with a warm, reflective tone.

Accuracy Notes:

- All sentences use **present tense** to maintain a consistent time frame.
- Each line is crafted with **rhythmic flow** and moderate length for oral pacing practice.
- When read correctly, there should be no abrupt breaks or uneven volume changes between readers.

Teacher Notes / Guide

Implementation Tips:

- Begin by modeling: read the first three sentences aloud with smooth handoffs between volunteers.
- Emphasize **listening and eye contact**; students should watch and anticipate their cue.
- After each full relay, have students rate their group's smoothness from 1 (choppy) to 5 (seamless).

Differentiation Ideas:

- For beginners, assign shorter or simpler sentences and practice in smaller pairs.
- For advanced groups, add a **second round** where students read expressively (excited, calm, mysterious, etc.).
