

## Who's in Control Here? - The Prompt Power Ranking Game Answer Key

### 1 (Most open-ended, least control):

#### A. *"Tell me something interesting."*

This prompt has no topic, no length, and no style requirements. The AI could respond with almost anything at all.

#### 2: C. *"Create a poem."*

This prompt is still very open, but it at least sets a type of writing - a poem - which gives the AI a little more direction.

#### 3: E. *"Describe a city."*

This prompt gives slightly more control because the AI has to focus on a city, but it does not specify which city, how long the description should be, or what details to include.

#### 4: B. *"Write a 5-sentence summary of the book Charlotte's Web, focusing only on the main character Wilbur."*

This prompt is more specific because it names a particular book, character, and sentence length. However, it does not give rules for tone or style.

#### 5: D. *"Write a 2-paragraph letter to the school principal, politely requesting longer lunch periods. Include two reasons and keep the tone respectful."*

This prompt is quite controlled because it gives the structure (two paragraphs), audience (the principal), tone (polite), and content requirements (two reasons).

### 6 (Most specific, most control):

#### F. *"Write a short story about a detective who solves a mystery using only clues found in a library. Keep the story under 200 words and end with a twist."*

This prompt is the most specific of all because it controls nearly everything: the type of story, the character, the setting, the source of clues, the word count, and even the ending.
