Sample answers. Students may write acceptable synonyms.

1. Nervous
2. Angry
3. Excited
4. Sad
5. Scared

Teacher's Guide

- This worksheet helps students interpret **showing sentences** by identifying the emotion through actions, posture, and movement.
- Remind students to look closely at **body language clues**, not the words themselves.

Differentiation Tips

- Provide a word bank of emotions for students who need support.
- Encourage students to act out each showing sentence before deciding on the emotion.
- Allow students to discuss answers with a partner before writing.

Engagement Ideas

- Turn this into a mini mystery game where students explain the clues that helped them decide the emotion.
- Have students create two showing sentences of their own and let classmates guess the emotions.

Extension Ideas

- Ask students to rewrite one showing sentence into a telling version, then compare both.
- Challenge advanced students to write a short two-sentence moment using two different showing clues for the same emotion.
